

In this Tony Award®-nominated play *The New York Times* calls "an uplifting folk ballad about the pure in heart," a young black man who has inherited a small farm in rural South Carolina has the whole world in his callused hands—until his sweetheart goes off to college and marries another man.

Opposing the draft at that time, he is thrown in jail for refusing to serve in the Vietnam war. Upon his release, he finds he has lost his farm. He heads north to build a new life, only to experience further struggles, before finally returning to the comforts of home and family.

Originally staged in 1979 to great acclaim by the Negro Ensemble Company, Samm-Art Williams' **HOME** is a melodic coming-of-age story that gives voice to the unbreakable spirit of all Americans who have been searching for a place to belong. Tony winner Kenny Leon (*A Raisin in the Sun; A Soldier's Play; Fences*) directs.
